A Zoom screen shot is now the "New Normal" for the group photo, and these are provided as ever (together with additional material, both photographic and filling crucial gaps in my memory) by Eccles.

This was another virtual Coronavirus special, and this time the Hare had set a quiz using the full gamut of Zoom technology. The pack were welcomed to the hash by an endless rerun of 10"s leap over the Iron Man (someone suggested that if we waited long enough we would see it all go badly wrong with dire consequences). The pack was initially divided into teams of three or four; though one team did have the dubious advantage of having two copies of 10secs, one of which started out speechless and later became invisible as well. Each team was given its own "breakout room" within Zoom. The first task of the teams was to devise a Team Name, incorporating the individual Hash Names in as witty a fashion as possible. We were given 5 minutes; the Quizmaster was able to pop up in our chat rooms from time to time to give us encouragement and/or sympathy as appropriate

The final results for the team names were: "It was all over in 20 seconds", "Ridikulous Cartel", "Sneccle Powered Hats", and Compo and the Brookettes". It would be a good extra quiz round to try to reconstruct the team members from the names... The Hare awarded these names 2, 2, 1 and 3 points respectively, which was probably fair. The next round, titled "Home and Away", started with a list of names of MTH3 hashers and the assignment was to decide whether these hashers had been christened by MTH3 ("Home")or by a different hash ("Away"); and in the latter case, for a bonus point, to identify that different hash. (See later for the list of names plus answers.) At this point the limits of Zoom began to reveal themselves; it proved impossible to display the list of hashers to more than one team at a time, and the Hare's appearances in each team room were greeted by a chorus of desperate complaints as the 5 minutes ticked inexorably by.

The final round was the crossword, which was fiendishly ingenious. We were first given the seven clues, in the form of cryptic MTH3-related questions. (Again, see later for the list of clues.) Firstly we went into team huddles to get the answers and fit them into a grid of our own making. We then emerged from the team rooms to show our answers, and fcuk then gave us a couple of examples of correct grids (see later). We then went back into our teams to adjust our answers if necessary to make them fit into the correct grids. If memory serves, and I could see the screen properly, most teams got the final grids pretty well exactly right, which was quite a triumph.

The marks were then added up

Compo & the Brookettes $-20 \frac{1}{2}$ Ridikulous Cartel $-22 \frac{1}{2}$ All over in 20 seconds -24Sneckle powered hat $-27 \frac{1}{2}$ and Sneccle Powered Hats proved to have overcome the initial handicap of their crappy name to emerge as clear victors.

Finally we shared some reminiscences of how each of us had acquired our names. Here they are for the record (possibly including some which weren't recounted at the time, for completeness...):

AP: it was claimed that he couldn't identify the American state in the crossword. When he refuted this, it was said he deserved a down-down just for being American.




Hovercrap also appeared, to share the glory and/or the shame of being American...

Snoozanne and Mad Hatter: Possibly for being part of the winning team...memories getting hazy by this point.



Crossword 7 words


Initial clues, then the length that was given after the first round:
